

Curator's Lecture: Discovering the Elusive Hugo Huber

March 15, 2010 – Akron, Ohio – In conjunction with the opening of *Discovering the Elusive Hugo Huber*, Guest Curator Holli Limbach presents a lecture on Hugo Huber on Friday, April 8 at 7pm. Limbach will share anecdotes and insights on Huber, gained from her extensive research of the interior designer of the Manor House at Stan Hywet.

Discovering the Elusive Hugo Huber is on display in the Manor House from April 1 – October 31, 2010. This exhibit is one of the first to take an in-depth look at the life and work of Hugo Huber, a key member of the New York design community at the turn of the 20th century, and the man who created the detailed interiors of the Manor House at Stan Hywet. Huber was well-known in his day and one of the earliest professionals in the field of interior decorating in the late 19th century—yet until now his accomplishments have been largely forgotten.

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About Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens

Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens, located in Akron, Ohio, is the former home of F.A. Seiberling, the founder of The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company, and his family. Completed in 1915, it is one of the most important remaining examples of an American Country Estate built by the wealth created during the Industrial Age at the turn of the twentieth century, when the emergence of modern America made Akron the “Rubber Capital of the World.” Open from April through December, Stan Hywet includes a 65-room Manor House and more than 70 acres of artfully landscaped grounds. It is Akron’s only National Historic Landmark and is accredited by the American Association of Museums.
