Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens, located in Akron, Ohio, is the former country estate of the family of F.A. Seiberling, the founder of The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company. Completed in 1915, it is one of the most important remaining examples of an American Country Estate built by the wealth created during the Industrial Age at the turn of the twentieth century, when the emergence of modern America made Akron the "Rubber Capital of the World."

In 1957, Stan Hywet became a non-profit historic estate museum so that the public could benefit from the cultural, educational, and inspirational riches of one of the most significant achievements in architecture and horticulture to come out of America's Industrial Age. Stan Hywet is accredited by the American Alliance of Museums.

The estate is currently open for self-guided tours of the historic Manor House and gardens.
